# Hagley Voted one of USA Today's 10Best

AGLEY'S UNIQUE LANDSCAPE, including a variety of outdoor interactive spaces across 235 acres, has been recognized as one of the 10Best Open Air Museums in USA TODAY's 10Best Contest. Open air museums "offer visitors the opportunity to see how people lived, worked, and played in different times featuring historic buildings, artifacts, and activities that help recreate the past."

In this readers' choice contest, Hagley went up against highly regarded attractions, including Connecticut's Mystic Seaport Museum, Virginia's Colonial Williamsburg, and Massachusetts' Plimoth Patuxet Museums.

Hagley was honored to land among the 10Best museums that allow visitors to "experience history and culture in a natural setting." After four weeks of nationwide voting, Hagley advanced from near the bottom of the leaderboard of twenty nominees (selected by a panel of experts), to finish in ninth place.

To Hagley members, this distinction comes as no surprise. The opportunity to walk along the Brandywine is often mentioned as a reason for being a loyal member. The proximity of Hagley's black powder factory to the river is no coincidence. "Waterpower was essential, being the only way one could power heavy machinery in the early nineteenth century," Hagley Historian Lucas Clawson explains. This property was "along a section of the Brandywine that could provide plenty of year-round waterpower."

Since Hagley has been named one of the 10Best Open Air Museums, the Hagley magazine is sharing ten favorite outdoor points of interest to look for on your journey from the Visitor Center to Eleutherian Mills:

**Lower Hagley Dam:** As you head down the pathway into the Powder Yard, one of the first sights to behold is water cascading over this beauty on the Brandywine, creating liquid artwork in the curvature of the river. The dams are a central feature of Hagley and are still used today to generate waterpower for demonstrations and to power Hagley's electric shuttle.

**Roll Mills:** Behold these imposing stone structures nestled among the ginkgo trees along the gravel river pathway. Be sure to check out Roll Mill #16, with a new exhibit that provides an overview of the du Pont family's beginnings in America.

**Mill Race:** Take a seat at a bench or picnic table at the end of the Machine Shop to enjoy a unique perspective of the mill race.

Machine Shop Turbine Exhibit: Cross the wooden bridge next to the Machine Shop and walk downhill towards the Turbine Exhibit. See how the intricate system harnessed the power of the water to operate nineteenth-century machinery. The Machine Shop still uses waterpower from this turbine to keep the lathes and drills running. Stop in for a demonstration.

**Yellow boxcar:** This bright yellow railcar is parked along tracks that run parallel to the mill race midway through the Powder Yard. It is one of the most photographed parts of Hagley and is doubly stunning when reflected in the mill race. This summer the tracks will be replaced as one of the final improvements as a result of the 2021 flood.


**Birkenhead Mill:** This imposing sixteen-foot wooden water wheel, found near the end of the Powder Yard, represents the history of energy production in early industrial America. Duck behind the water wheel to stand on a platform that offers an up-close view of the Brandywine.

**Crowninshield Garden:** Hagley has its own secret garden. While it's not open to the public as a stabilization project gets underway, those who walk by it are treated to a glimpse of this tiered, Italianate 1920s ruin garden designed by Hagley's last residents, Louise and Frank Crowninshield.

**E. I. du Pont Garden:** This French-style garden reflects the design by E. I. du Pont in 1804. Unique features include heirloom fruits, flowers, and vegetables, espaliered peach trees, and parterre beds.

**Eleutherian Mills Residence:** The du Pont ancestral home sits on a high bank of the Brandywine overlooking the original powder mills. Five generations of the du Pont family lived in this Georgian-style home, draped in wisteria that yields beautiful purple flowers from late April to early May.

**Eleutherian Mills Piazza:** Step outside the double glass doors of the main level of Hagley's historic home to catch a panoramic view of the original Powder Yard now the Crowninshield Garden below.

# Summer Kick-Off Celebration

n the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend, May 25, Hagley Museum and Library will celebrate the unofficial start to summer with programs, activities, and tours called the Summer Kick-off Celebration.

For families with children, there will be Science Saturday programming in the DuPont Discovery Loft and hands-on activities in the *Nation of Inventors* exhibition in the Visitor Center. On Workers' Hill—the partially restored worker's community in the historic DuPont powder yards—kids of all ages can immerse themselves in nineteenth-century life with activities in the home of a powder yard foreman and in the Sunday School, where Victorine du Pont Bauduy taught and served as superintendent for more than 40 years.

Throughout the powder yards, guests of all ages can experience the wonders of nineteenth-century waterpower with two ongoing demonstrations: the 1870s machine shop and as the last-of-their-kind, two eight-ton roll wheels that were used to mix the ingredients of black powder. The day will also feature gunpowder demonstrations, including cannon firings throughout the afternoon.

For Hagley super-fans, there will also be special, behind-the-scenes talks and tours. Two talks in the Powder Yard will feature Hagley's mechanical exhibits supervisor in discussions of what it takes to keep nineteenth-century industrial equipment running, much of it via waterpower from the Hagley dams. On the other end of the museum grounds, guests can take a rare look inside the historical greenhouse complex and walk through the E. I. du Pont Garden and orchard with Hagley's Gardens and Horticulture team.

The du Pont Family's ancestral home at Eleutherian Mills and the new *Du Ponts Down the Road* historical vehicle exhibition in the barn will be open as well.

Throughout the grounds, guests will have a chance to visit displays by some of Hagley's community partners to learn how Hagley promotes the cultural health of the region. There will also be a food truck or two and other activities throughout the property. The whole property will be open for walking on May 25, including areas typically closed to guests.

# The Illustrious & Industrious Lea Family

**N WILMINGTON,** the Lea name is ubiquitous. The family, descended from Quaker minister John Lea, became renowned for their flour mills and early industrial development of the Brandywine. Their name can be seen on street signs and businesses and is found often on regional deeds and corporate documents housed in the Hagley Library archives.

This past autumn, William Edward "Bill" Lea IV and his daughter Barbara delivered more than fifty items to Hagley. A subsequent appraisal by the Philadelphia Rare Books & Manuscripts Co. revealed a few historical treasures.

Much of this collection dates from the mid-eighteenth century to the late-nineteenth century. A notable exception is a 1679 English royal patent that lists land grants given to colonists who settled along the Christina River, including three women grantees. Additional maps document ownership and land indentures throughout Delaware and eastern Pennsylvania. Some business deals involved the Leas as witnesses, while others deeded them ownership.

The Leas' business interests can be studied in letters between family members, such as William Lea (1805-1876), Henry Lea (1812-1830), Elizabeth Lea (1793-1858), and Thomas Lea (1789-1829). The letters include the expected exchanges on their personal lives but also attention to their entrepreneurial activities, particularly the agricultural and milling industries.

The remainder of this collection documents their comfortable lifestyle: social invitations and tickets; school notebooks; photos and daguerreotypes of family and friends; and a marriage certificate. The latter is a beautiful piece of white vellum with signatures from 56 guests at the 1867 wedding of Sarah Brooke Bentley to William Lea, Jr. Such documentation provides a glimpse into past social relationships and experiences.


# THE WORLDS OF JEFFERSON AND DU PONT

HOMAS JEFFERSON HAD A LONG ASSOCIATION with the du Pont family. Pierre Samuel du Pont de Nemours first met Jefferson after the American Revolution, when Jefferson served as U.S. ambassador to France. Their friendship lasted until du Pont's death in 1817. Their letters touched on politics, architecture, the places they lived and traveled, and even Merino sheep. Jefferson also corresponded with Victor and E.I. du Pont about business and American economic conditions. The du Pont family and DuPont Company emphasized these connections to Thomas Jefferson during the twentieth century, especially during the company's sesquicentennial celebrations in 1952.

Hagley is partnering with Thomas Jefferson's Poplar Forest on Tuesday, July 30, for a free program that will dive into the connection. Poplar Forest is Jefferson's personal retreat, built near Lynchburg, Virginia, between 1806 and 1826. Poplar Forest recently completed a decades-long architectural and landscape renovation project to restore the site to its appearance during Jefferson's lifetime. The site is open to the public and interprets Jefferson and his family along with the craftsmen and enslaved workers who built and maintained the estate.

Hagley Historian Lucas R. Clawson will lead a discussion with Travis McDonald, former architectural historian at Poplar Forest, and Bill Barker, who has interpreted Thomas Jefferson since the 1990s, most notably for Colonial Williamsburg. They will talk about the friendship between the du Pont family and Jefferson, their homes and how they used them, restoration and maintenance of historical landscapes, and the intellectual worlds Jefferson and the du Ponts lived in.

This event will be held in the Soda House Auditorium, starting with a reception from 6 to 7 p.m. with light refreshments and featuring items on display from Hagley's collections about Thomas Jefferson and the du Pont family. The discussion will start at 7, with time for audience questions at the end. Visit hagley.org/Jefferson for details and registration.



#### ANNUAL LETTER FROM HAGLEY BOARD PRESIDENT HENRY B. DUPONT IV



HE BRANDYWINE RIVER, which drives the water works of the Hagley Powder Yard, is the heartbeat of Hagley. The historical Hagley dams channel the power of rushing water to drive our turbines and roll mills, and they even power our electric shuttle. It is innovation. It is our story.

Our use of the river is a legacy that dates back to colonial times, when dams were used by our growing nation to power mills producing textiles, lumber, leather, flour, and gun powder. In recent years, Hagley has worked with groups that were studying the river to determine how best to get fish species, such as shad, over our dams, providing a win/win solution for nature and history. We are committed to keeping intact our historical dams that so dynamically illustrate the awesome power of the river. I invite you to visit Hagley on May 25 for our Summer Kick-Off Celebration to see for yourself what wonders the dams provide.

This past year we've completed many repairs in the Hagley Powder Yard to keep the water flowing to our fascinating demonstrations. For example, Hagley uses the power of the Brandywine to provide clean, green energy for our 1870s machine shop, keeping it off the electrical grid. At the Eagle Roll Mill, the two eight-ton roll wheels are also powered by a historical water turbine. And in recent years we have adapted a 19th-century water turbine to power our electric shuttle.

If you've visited Hagley in 2023, you saw much activity in the powder yard as we completed several

multi-year projects. The recently rebuilt Birkenhead waterwheel had its finishing touches put in place as new sheds to cover the gearing were installed. This iconic wheel is once again the highlight of our school program waterpower tours. Another impressive rebuild took place at the Eagle Roll Mill where mechanical exhibits staff dismantled the turbine to clean out debris and unclog its moving parts. Without a manual to guide them, they literally learned how to fix it in real time, demonstrating for our visitors the power of innovation in action! After hundreds of hours of challenging work, the two eight-ton roll wheels are turning again, providing Hagley visitors a "wow" moment. We're grateful to donors who joined Hagley's 1817 Society, named to honor Pierre Samuel du Pont de Nemours, to fund these projects.

Having a consistent source of power throughout the seasons was always a challenge in the powder yard. When the river was too high, too low, or too frozen, DuPont generated power for the mills using steam. The Steam Engine exhibit, located upstream from the Birkenhead Mills, features a locomotive-style boiler that is getting a major overhaul at the Strasburg Railroad machine shop.

Another important aspect of work in the powder yard was the ability to quickly fix broken machinery. This was done in the Machine Shop. Today the 19th-century Machine Shop, located mid-property, is another of the fascinating demonstrations Hagley visitors enjoy. In the shop, restoration work funded by the Crestlea Foundation turned back the hands

of time when soot and grime were cleaned from the walls, which were then painted bright white. The machinery was cleaned, conserved, and lubricated, and new lighting now makes them shine. Please stop by for a demonstration!

The Museum also spent 2023 building audience engagement, attendance, and revenue after several years of challenges including the pandemic, tornado, and flood. Attendance is close to returning to pre-pandemic levels due to increases in adult tours, school tours, and general visitors. With the 2023 opening of our new hands-on innovation space, the DuPont Discovery Loft in the Hagley Visitor Center, and *DuPonts Down the Road* in the historical Barn, Hagley has a renewed focus on innovation which is driving our attendance and membership growth.

The Library has been working to broaden the scope of collections by focusing on materials describing the experience of minorities and women in business. A new initiative, In Her Own Words: Women in Enterprise, formalized in 2023 an Advisory Group of women from business and academia, and conducted the first oral history with Catalyst CEO Lorraine Hariton. In addition, the library's series on Black STEM Pioneers in Delaware published the Rosetta McKinley Henderson digital exhibition, featuring outtakes from and links to the oral history interview of Ms. Henderson taken in 2022. You can see this digital exhibition, and many others, at www.hagley.org.

Hagley's Preservation, Buildings and Grounds division continues to work with FEMA on flood recovery, a long and painstaking process. Despite the ongoing flood recovery work, inroads have been made with new projects throughout the property. Installation is almost complete on the replacement of the Building Automation System (BAS) in the Library, Soda House, Hall of Records, and Visitor Center buildings that was partially funded through the generosity of the Longwood Foundation. Security was also on our minds this year as Hagley invested in additional measures to protect the Soda House, Hall of Records, and Residence/First Office.

The Development Department continues to rebuild this year with a new Director, Joan Thomas, and Development Manager, Jenna Laczkowski, now in place. While philanthropy remains strong at Hagley thanks to you, our donors and friends, the Development team is actively developing several major campaigns for the near future to advance our strategic goals and to address some significant capital upgrades to protect our collections. I hope to share information about these plans with you soon.

This was also a rebuilding year for Gardens and Horticulture with a change in their leadership and several staff positions. We promoted Cat Meholic to Director, Gardens and Horticulture and her enthusiasm and knowledge of Hagley have positioned her well to create a dynamic horticultural team. With a renewed focus on handson horticulture, the new team has had success in getting the new Rose Garden planted, studying the Crowninshield Garden and interfacing with the planning team, and they are working on plans for a revived cutting garden and pollinator garden. Their harvests from the E.I. du Pont Garden to local food banks in 2023 topped 1,400 pounds of produce! We're grateful for a grant from the Chichester duPont Foundation which will allow us to process our produce more efficiently and better serve those in need.

As Board President I cannot be prouder of the work of our staff and volunteers to share, interpret, and engage Hagley with the community. And to you, who have contributed in so many ways to Hagley this past year, you empowered us by being the water to our wheel. Thank you. I look forward to seeing you again at Hagley soon.
